<p>1. The residential treatment facility is reporting self-harm behaviors, some physical aggression and elopement behaviors. How does the family safely bring her home given these concerns?</p> <p>2.The family and facility have struggled in identifying “triggers” for the youth. She will be fine one minute and then significantly escalate. How can we identify problematic times for youth to try to prevent crisis situations?</p> <p>3. What other recommendations does the Hub and learning community have for the presenting team? What have we missed?</p>

Individual Developmental	<p>Youth has significant behavioral health concerns and needs a thorough assessment to accurately diagnose her.</p> <p>She has self-harm behaviors, elopement from home/community, and physical aggression to others.</p>	<p>Youth's mental/emotional instability makes it difficult to complete accurate assessments. She has not been compliant in the past with testing.</p>	<p>Youth has an extensive team consisting of natural and professional supports, including a psychiatrist from a children's hospital and staff from the residential setting.</p>
Home Family	<p>Family conflict, youth leaves without permission, threatens to punch parents & destroy property. Parents are tired and have lost hope.</p>	<p>Youth will not have staff available 24/7 to address her behaviors and behavioral health needs in the home setting. Parents want her to be stable before returning home.</p>	<p>Youth's parents want her to return home as soon as possible. They are very educated about her needs and advocate strongly for her.</p>
School	<p>Youth's needs were too significant and time-consuming for her school in the community setting. She was removed from a specialized school during last school year and lost her special education placement.</p>	<p>Youth's behavioral health created inconsistent performance in school due to her emotional instability.</p>	<p>Youth is an excellent writer and creative. She currently is receiving online schooling at treatment center.</p>
Community	<p>Youth has been charged with assaulting staff at residential treatment center. She is awaiting a court hearing for those charges and will be completing a competency evaluation.</p>	<p>Youth will be completing a competency evaluation.</p>	<p>Family has tried to reach out to community supports and are strong advocates for youth.</p>
Cultural & Religious	<p>Youth identifies as Christian but has not attended any church or religious events since being in placement.</p>	<p>Limited access to church and youth groups. Adoptive parents are White, and youth does not have any contact with the African American community or her biological parents' culture.</p>	<p>Youth has a supportive church family who has continued as part of the family team.</p>
Health Concerns	<p>Youth was prenatally exposed to drugs and alcohol.</p> <p>Poor sleep since placement.</p>	<p>Her menses is infrequent and has mood fluctuations.</p>	<p>Youth has generally good physical health.</p>

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Risk & Safety	Youth has engaged in physical aggression, self-harm behaviors and sometimes thinks about suicide. She has eloped from home and community.	Youth's behavioral health instability has prevented her from maintaining safely in the community setting.	Youth is currently in a residential setting that can monitor her risk/safety concerns 24/7.



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
